## PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

#### Dear Families,



l am so thankful to be working with such a dedicated staff, passionate students and caring parents. This week, I've noticed a surge in acts of kindness and advocacy. For example, some fourth graders are writing words of encouragement to send with the candy collected for cancer patients. A third grader has offered to teach others how to draw cartoon characters at recess, and some fifth graders are using their recess to write letters to advocate for a dress code that equally impacts all students. Our entire school participated in honoring veterans at our Veteran's Day Assembly in a very moving assembly.

This type of advocacy work is at the heart of our writing curriculum. When you hear the term Writing Workshop you will know that each day's teaching includes writing strategies, and lots of practice in the writing process. At every grade level students are learning how to tell stories with personal significance, how to share their opinions in a convincing way, and how to grab the attention of the reader in informational pieces. One of our school goals this year is to make sure that all families feel included, welcomed and connected to our school community. We would like to invite all families to take part in our Muliti-culture Night on November 21st at 6:00 PM. I can't wait to see the displays, but I am most eager to try lots of yummy food. My husband is Nicaraguan and my roots are a mix of European cultures, so perhaps I'll bring Tres Leches cake or maybe I'll bring mac and cheese. Whatever you want to bring to the potluck is welcomed. Let's teach our children that we can celebrate our different cultures, AND we are all part of the Hilltop Elementary community.

We are happy to announce that we have made some changes to our drop-off/pick-up procedures to get more vehicles in and out of the parking lot in a quicker and safer manner. Please pull forward to as far past the crosswalk as possible. This will get more cars off of Damson Road and ensure that your child is being supervised by our staff. It may feel faster for you to drop off a child near the bike racks, but it stops all of the traffic behind you and leads to back-ups on Damson Road.
